- Invited by Infomedia TV at the seventh edition of the International Free Software Forum, April 19-22, 2006 (<u>http://fisl.softwarelivre.org</u>), Cesar hosted a "talk-show" on free and open source software solutions developed by Solis and also participated in a series of debates with Microsoft representatives on interoperability. These debates had great repercussion in the specialized and non-specialized media, national and international.

Cesar was one of the founders and was elected as the Vice-President of the co-operative during its start-up and now acts as marketing consultant for Solis, establishing relationships between Solis and new customers.

• B&W Informática was an investment with a group of partners (mostly relatives) to bring Internet access to the region of Lajeado (Taquari River Valley). Since the beginning, B&W partnered with Univates in order to start an Internet Service Provider. The company now operates independently and still is the biggest ISP in the region.

• Started with the Brazilian subsidiary of Tandem Computers Inc. as soon as it was founded in Brazil in order to help startup the local operation. For the first six months was the sole Support Analyst and

have been trained in the United States and Canada on Tandem's Guardian (today NonStop Kernel) and Unix (Integrity) products. As the support team grew, took the position of Support Manager, leading a team of six support analysts by the end of 1995. Worked on Tandem installations on several Brazilian financial institutions such as Unibanco, Bradesco and Banco America do Sul. By mid 1995 also acted as Marketing Manager, organizing the presence of Tandem at the Comdex trade-show.
